Rules for Sorting **Recyclables** and **Waste**

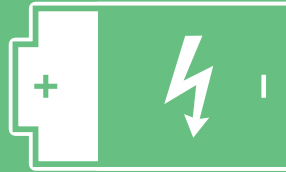
Empty Cans / PET Bottles



Collected once a week

Cans that contained food or beverage, and spray cans with their content consumed;
PET bottles that contained food or seasoning with the mark.

Used Batteries



Collected once a week

End-of-life battery cells and lithium coin cells. (model number starting with CR or BR)

Empty Bottles



Collected once a week

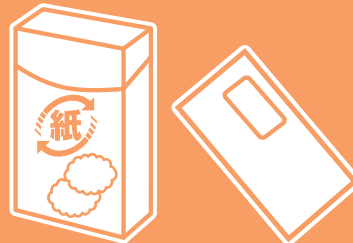
Bottles that contained beverages or seasonings.

Recyclables

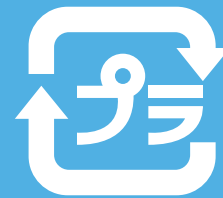
Mixed paper



Collected once a week

All paper except the items collected by local recyclable resource collection groups and dirty paper and paper with strong smell.

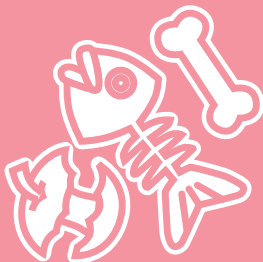
Plastic Containers and Packaging



Collected once a week

Containers and packaging made of plastic materials that contained products.

Ordinary Garbage



Collected twice a week

Kitchen garbage and refuse other than recyclables, small metal articles, and oversized garbage.

Small Metal Articles



Collected twice a month

Metal articles (articles made of metal in whole or in part) smaller than 30 cm, umbrellas, and wire hangers.

Oversized Garbage (pay service)



Collected twice a month with prior application

Metal articles of 30 cm or larger, furniture items of 50 cm or larger, etc.

Empty Cans / PET Bottles



Beverage cans



Sweets cans



Spray can with the content consumed



PET bottles with the mark



Cans of food and can lids



Caps and labels of PET bottles should be removed and included in plastic containers.

Empty Bottles



Bottles of beverage, seasoning or food

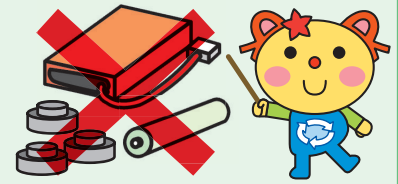


Vases, glass/ceramic bottles, bottles of cosmetics should be wrapped with thick paper and included in ordinary garbage with the indication "Broken/fragile articles, handle with care."

Used Batteries



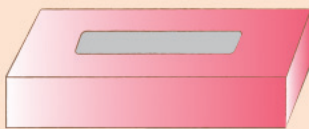
Laminated/cylindrical lithium coin cells (CR or BR)



Button cells and rechargeable batteries should be taken to electrical appliance shops and recycling partner shops.

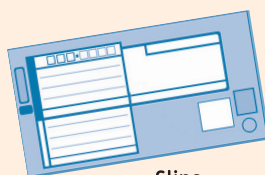
If you are worried about personal information, delete it before disposing of paper articles.

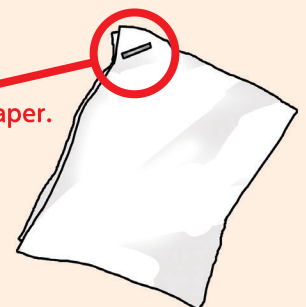

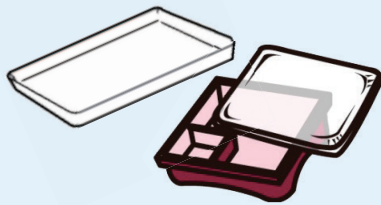
Stapler needles may be left on paper.

Check the ♻️ mark for cup noodle containers



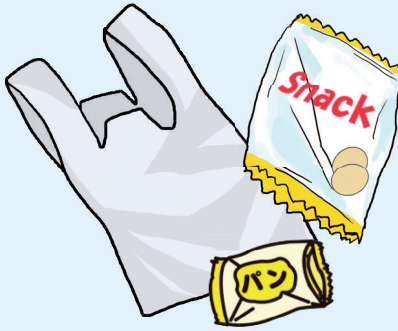

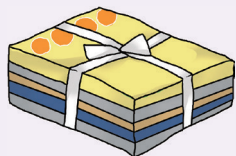
Dishes, bowls, flower pots, electric bulbs (including LED bulbs)

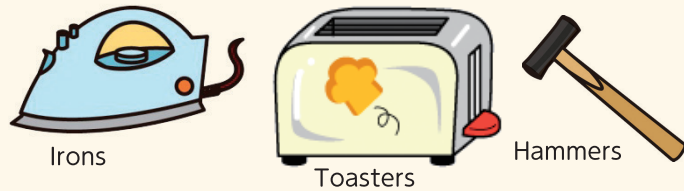
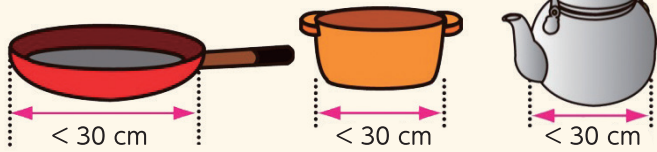
Articles collected, collection points and collection days vary by group. Contact the local life and environment office for more information.



Small Metal Articles

Metal articles made of metal in whole or in part, smaller than 30 cm

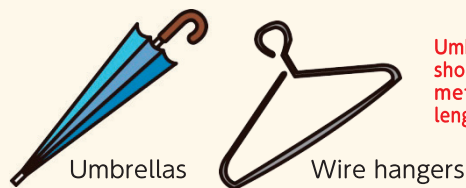
Cooking utensils with the longest side < 30 cm, excluding the handle or spout



Irons

Toasters

Hammers



Umbrellas

Wire hangers

Umbrellas and wire hangers should be included in small metal articles even if the length exceeds 30 cm.

Please cooperate in the collection of small home appliances at collection points.



Small home appliances

Home appliances with the longest side < 30 cm that can be put into the slot of a small home appliance collection box



Slot 30cm x 15cm

Slot for cell phones

Collection boxes are installed at ward offices, branches, local life, and environment offices, etc.



Oversized Garbage

Prior application required (pay service)

Metal articles of 30 cm or larger, furniture items of 50 cm or larger, etc. that were used at home



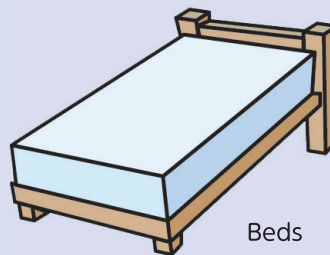
Gas ovens

These appliances are subject to the Home Appliance Recycling Act, and should be taken to the shop of purchase or a home appliance recycling partner shop.

The collection of oversized garbage requires prior application, and disposal fees are charged.
